NYMTC is a regional council of governments which serves as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for New York City, Long Island and the lower Hudson Valley. One of NYMTC's major responsibilities under federal law is the development of the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) which is a 25-year blueprint that guides investment in the region's transportation system. It establishes policies and strategies for all modes of travel – motor vehicles, transit, walking and bicycling – as well as the movement of freight and goods. The current Plan was adopted in August 2005 and under federal law it must be updated every four years.

This will be the first in a series of public meetings to gather input for the 2010-2035 Regional Transportation Plan as it develops. **The section for review and comment on January 24th is "Overarching Issues and Trends."** It is the first completed draft section of the Plan update, and discusses some of the external factors or conditions which are likely influence transportation planning and policy-making in the long-term.
