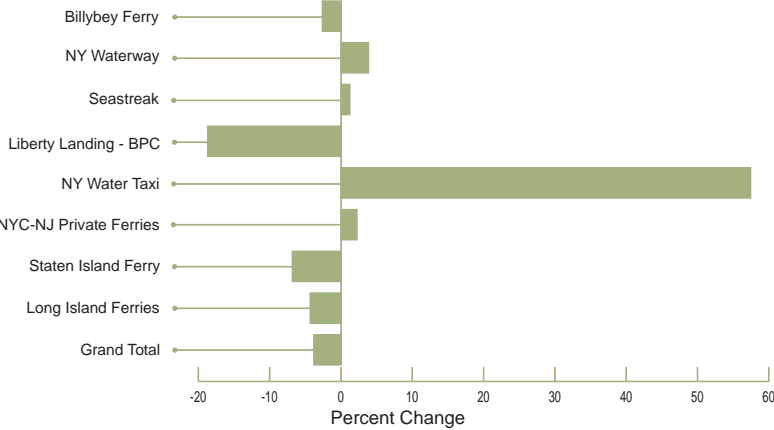


Average Weekday Ferry Ridership by Ferry Operator Q4 2005- Q4 2006 Percent Change

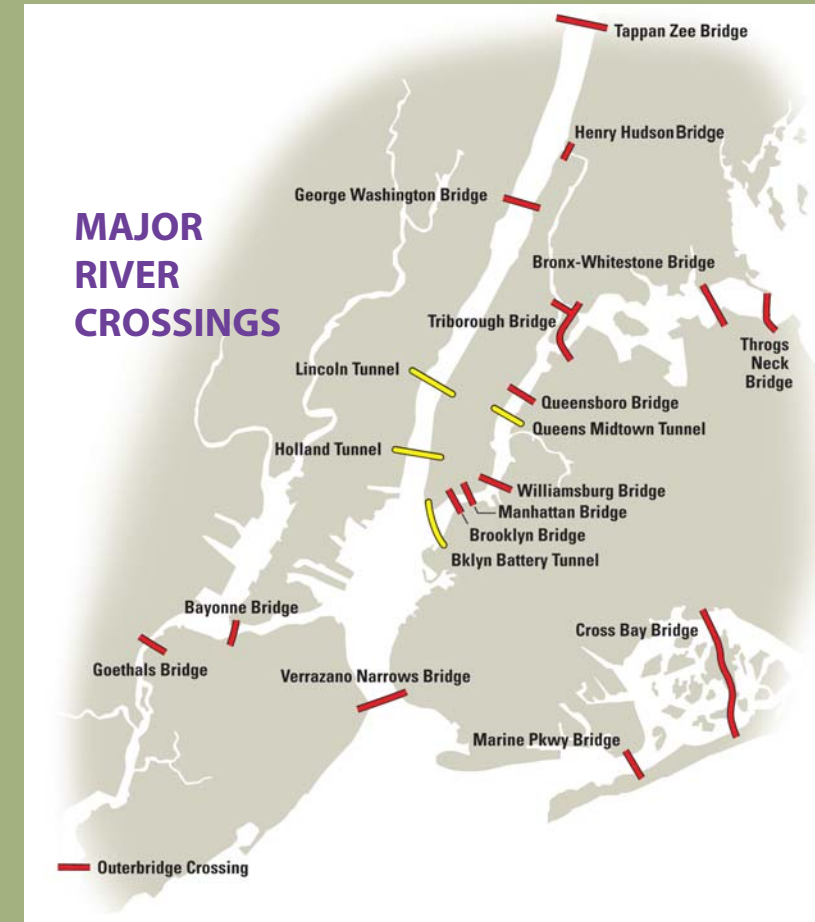

TRAVEL PATTERNS in the New York Metropolitan Area FOURTH QUARTER (Q4) 2006

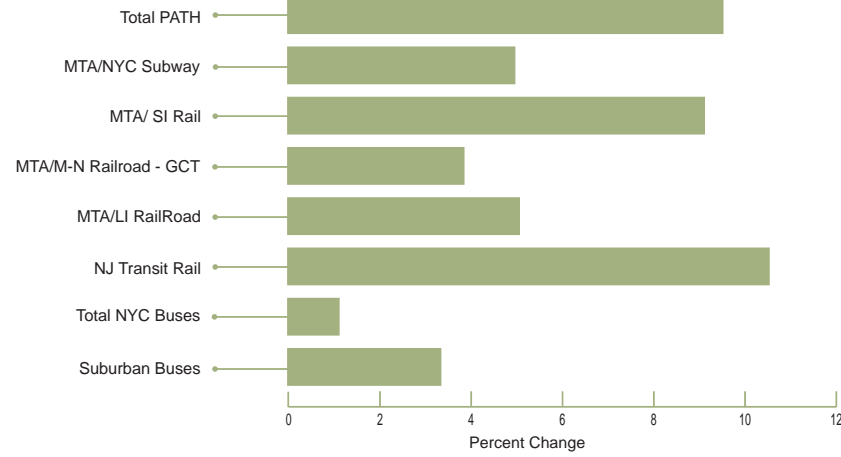

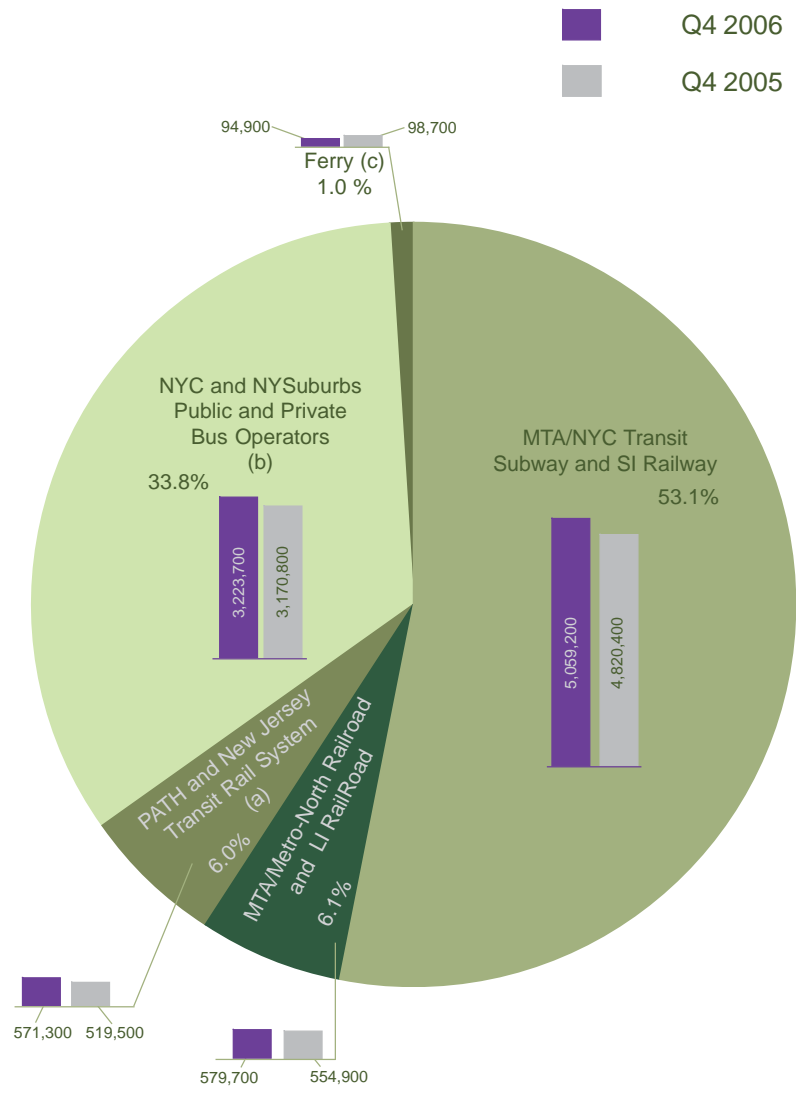

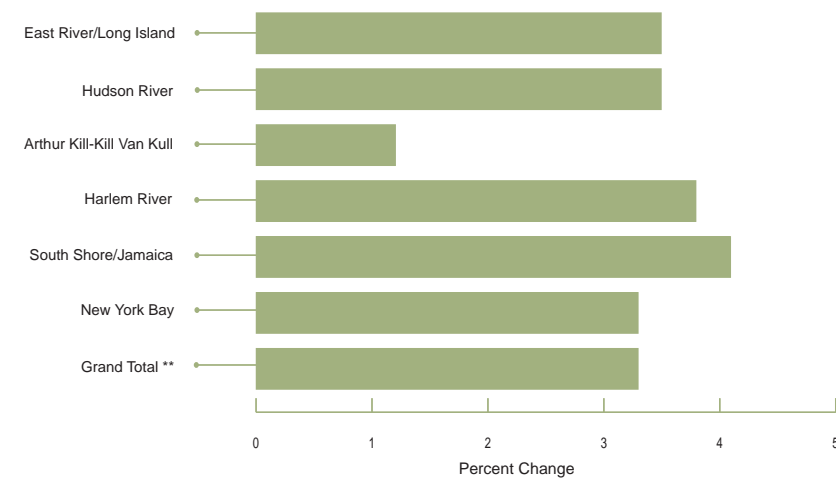
