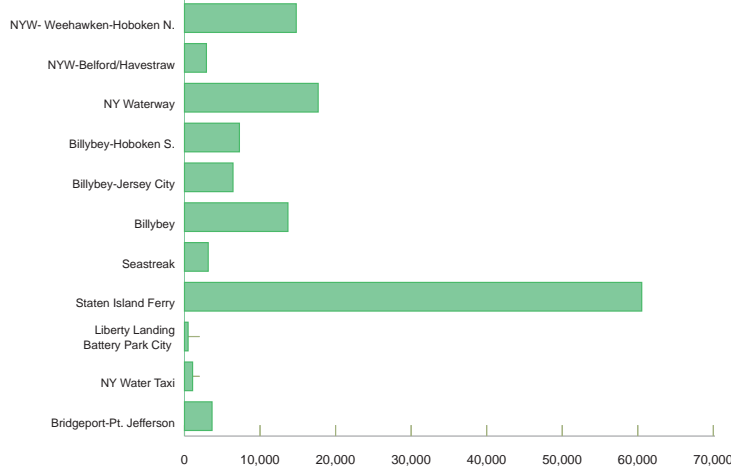

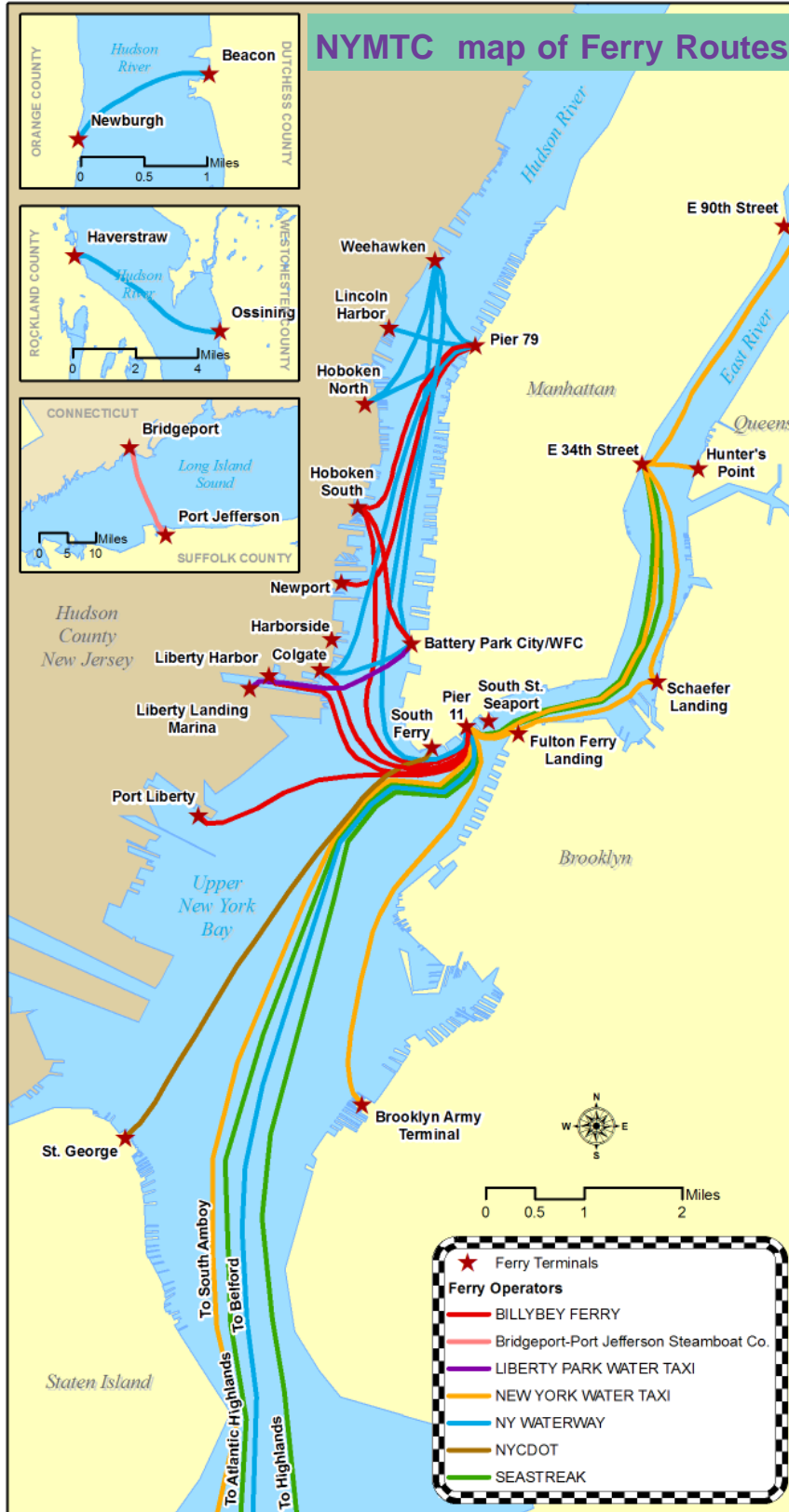

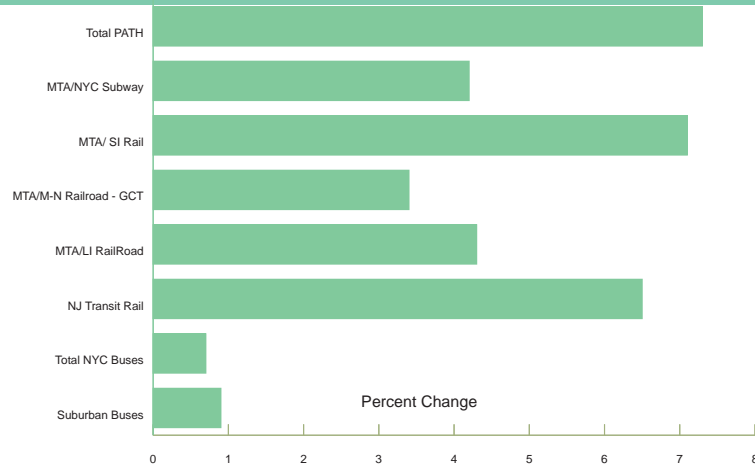

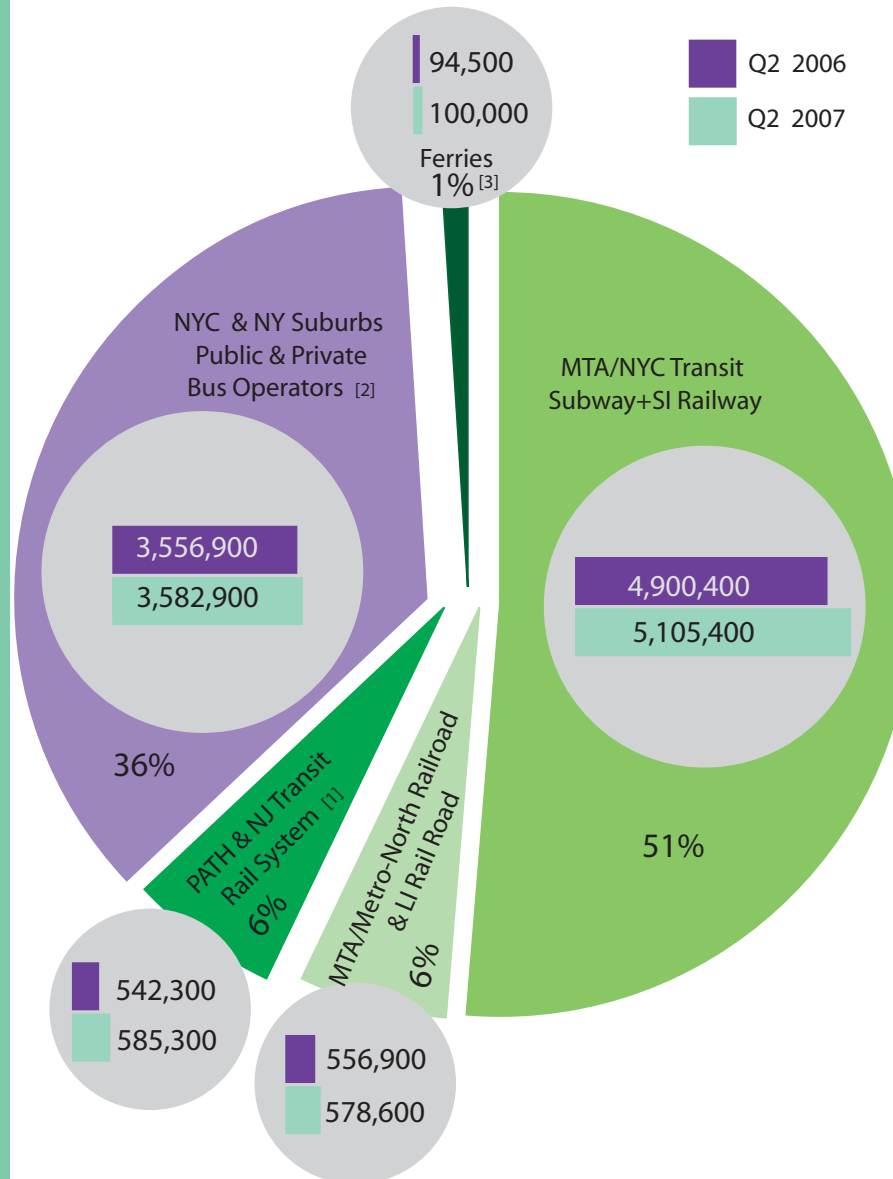

Average Weekday Bus and Rail Ridership by Operator Q2 2006-Q2 2007 Percent Change



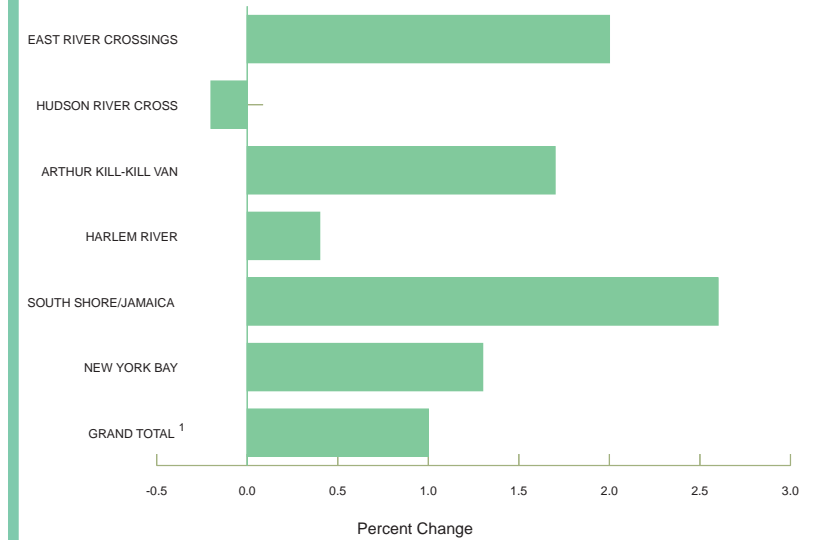
Average Weekday Passengers by Public Transportation Q2 2006 and Q2 2007
