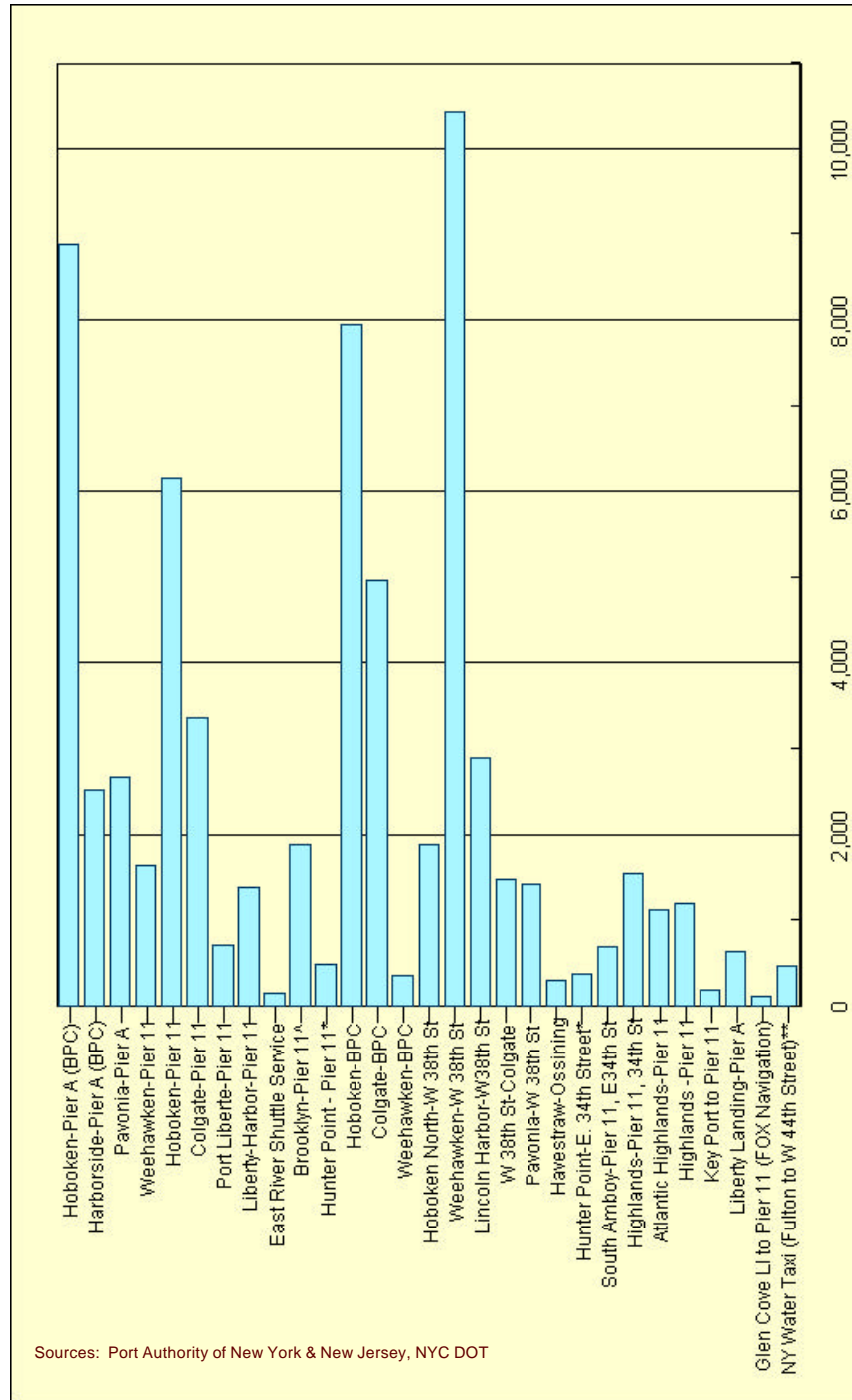


The New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC), an association of governments and transportation providers, is pleased to release the Third Quarter 2002 brochure: **Travel Patterns in the New York Metropolitan Area**. This statistical information will be updated and made public on a regular basis, and is designed to provide a glance at changing regional travel patterns.

The data were collected from the agencies responsible for operating each facility. In using these data it is important to keep in mind that regional travel patterns can change for a variety of reasons, such as economic changes, service disruptions, construction, weather conditions, or seasonal travel variations. It is extremely difficult to isolate the exact reasons for the changing patterns, so these data should be used with caution.

Private Ferry Average Weekday Ridership by Ferry Terminal Third Quarter - 2002

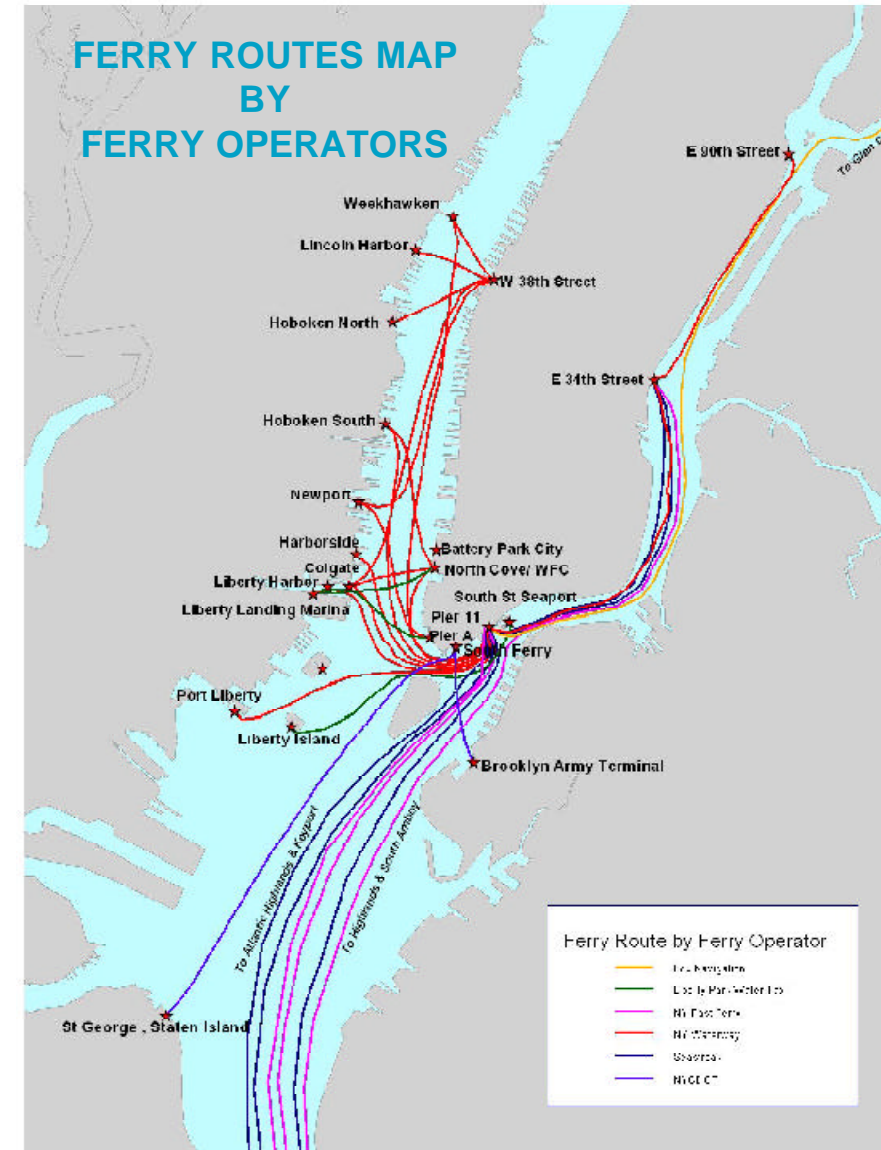

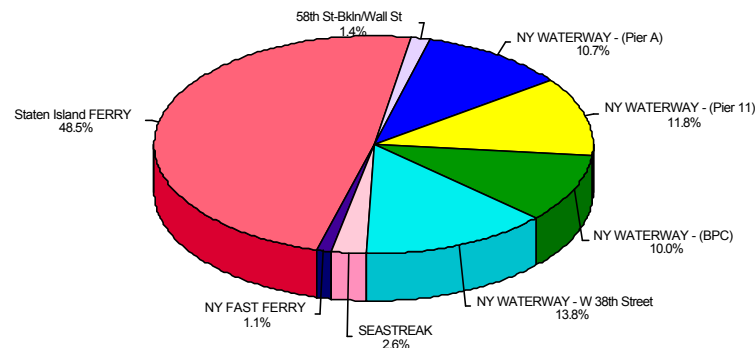

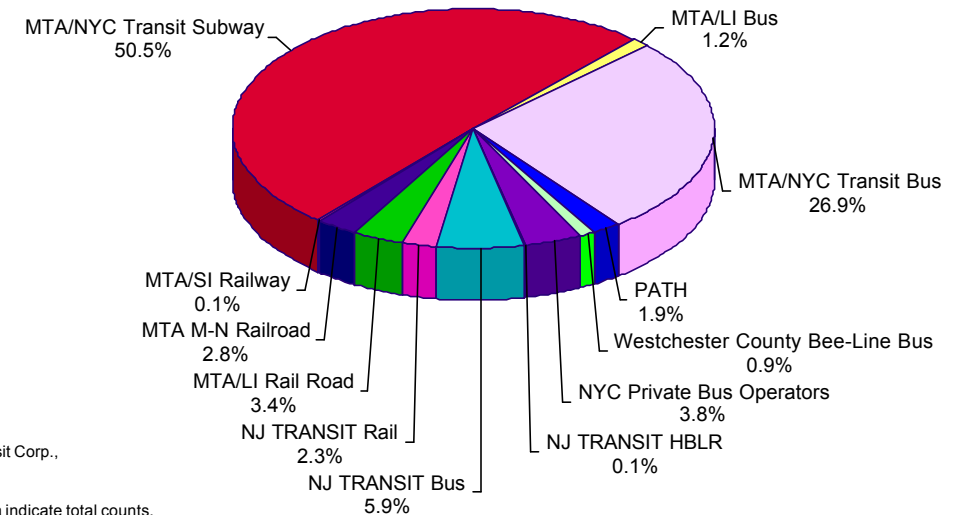
Effective Sept. 26, 2001 the Single Occupancy Vehicle (SOV) ban was established south of 69th Street crossings.
