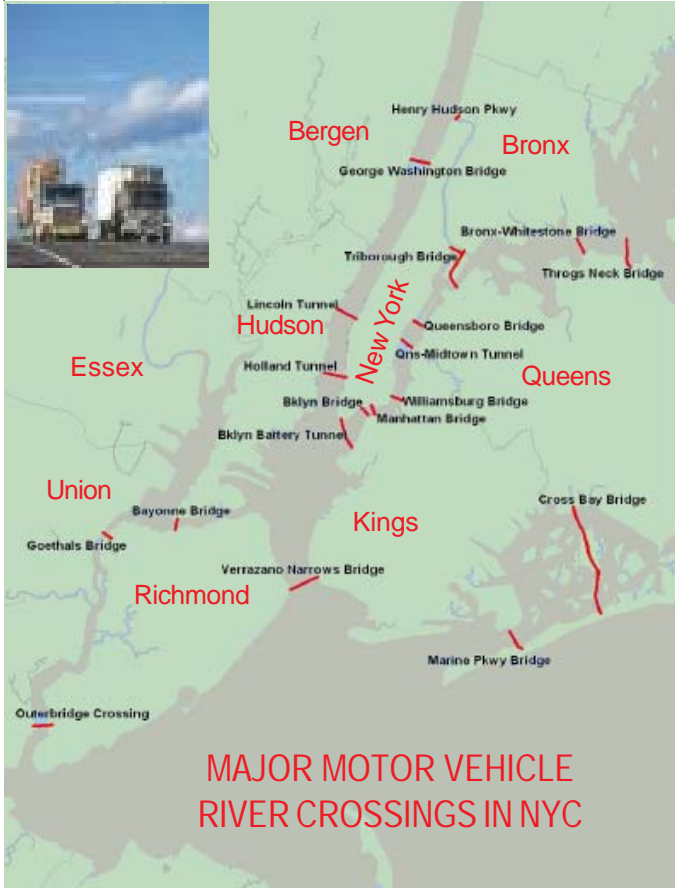


ANNUAL TRUCK TOLL VOLUME - 2004

Freight transportation is a critical component of the New York Metropolitan Transportation Council's Regional Transportation Plan. The Council collects and analyzes relevant data in the assessment of progress toward the achievement of its transportation plans, goals and objectives. The monitoring of truck volumes is identified as a performance measure. The monitored data are collected on an ongoing basis from public agencies that operate toll facilities in the five boroughs of the New York City, as well as sections of the Garden State Parkway, New Jersey Turnpike, and upstate bridges. The monitored data are analyzed for a 24-month period for 2003 and 2004 and provide information on highway-based freight movement in the metropolitan region.

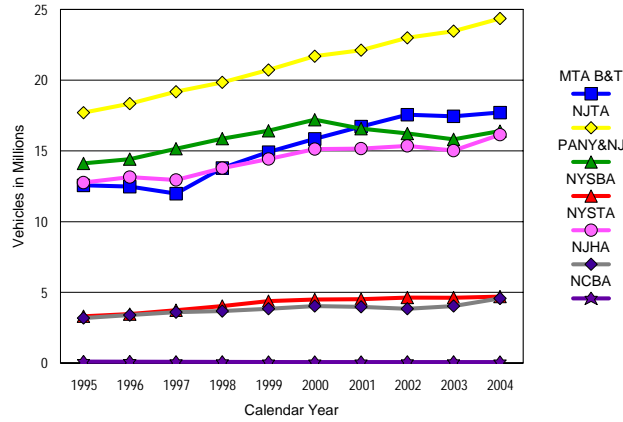

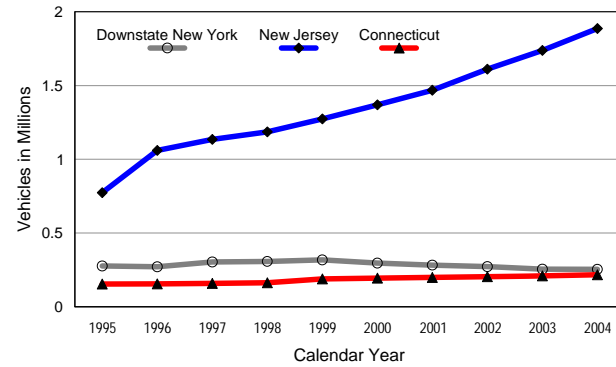
MAJOR MOTOR VEHICLE RIVER CROSSINGS IN NYC

TRUCK TOLL VOLUME TRENDS



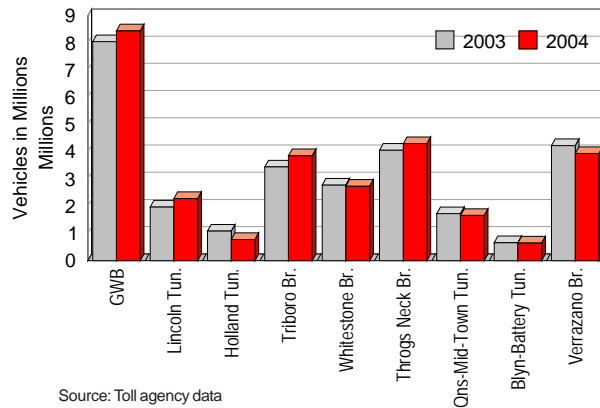

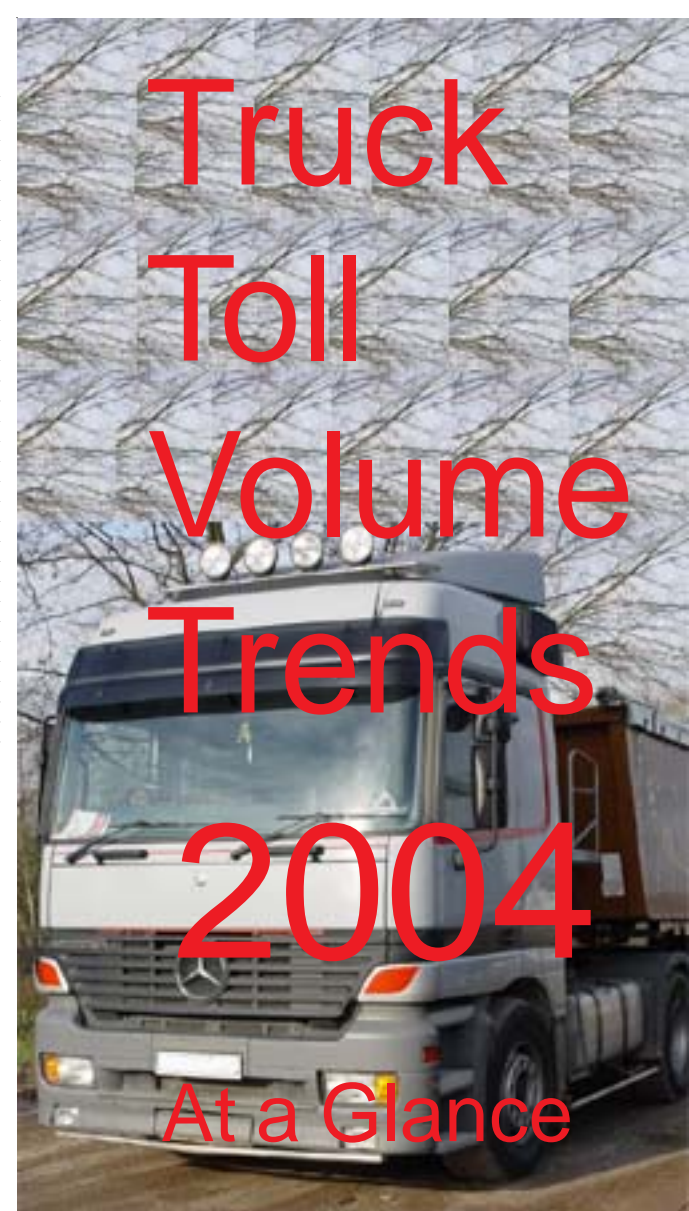
