Synopsis of the September 18, 2008 Meeting of the Program, Finance and Administration Committee (PFAC) of the New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC)

A. CALL TO ORDER, INTRODUCTIONS AND REPORTS

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Robert Zerrillo, Director of the Office of Policy Planning & Performance for the New York State Department of Transportation and Chair of the NYMTC Program, Finance, and Administration Committee (PFAC). Mr. Zerrillo said that the meeting was being webcast. He asked the PFAC members to introduce themselves and he determined that there was a quorum.

Mr. Zerrillo pointed out that NYMTC staff was working to update the Regional Transportation Plan, the Transportation Improvement Program and the Unified Planning Work Program. He added that staff was also in the process of developing new forecast of traffic congestion, a new regional emissions analysis for air quality conformity and a new environmental justice assessment for the planning process.

1. NYMTC Executive Director's Report

Mr. Joel Ettinger announced that NYMTC was losing three key employees to retirement—Juliette Bergman, Robert Donohue and Mary Hrabowska, and he wished them all well. He announced that a Metropolitan Planning Workshop would be held on September 25, 2008 to discuss NYMTC draft Technology Scan and said that flyers were available at the sign-in table. He said that NYMTC would hold community workshops in late September and early October for the new Regional Transportation Plan in the five boroughs of New York City and each of NYMTC's suburban counties. Mr. Ettinger talked about the NYMTC fall conference which would focus on transit-oriented development and said that NYMTC was partnering with New York University's Rudin Center and the conference would be held on November 14, 2008. Flyers were available at the sign-in table.

B. PRESENTATION

Chris O. Ward, Executive Director, Port Authority of New York and New Jersey

Executive Director Chris Ward of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey talked about his formulation of the "urban machine" and – in that context - discussed the Port Authority's plans to support job growth, regional competitiveness and sustainable development in the regional area over the next 30 years. Mr. Ward talked about the Port Authority's ten-year capital program to renew its key transportation facilities and to expand transit and freight-handling capacity to meet the needs of the future. C. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Mr. George Haikalis, President of the Institute for Rational Urban Mobility, Inc., talked about regional cooperation among New York, New Jersey and Connecticut. See the attached remarks.

Martin Treat, Hell's Kitchen Neighborhood Association, would like the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey to review and consider all or part of the NYMTC study, 9th Avenue – Hell's

Kitchen Study. Mr. Treat said that 9th Avenue should not have the burden of all seven of the exits cues of the Lincoln Tunnel and feels the exits could be spread around more.

D. ACTION ITEMS

1. Accept: August 21, 2008 Meeting Synopsis

A motion to accept the August 21, 2008 was made by Mr. Lawrence Berger, representing the Nassau/Suffolk Transportation Coordinating Committee, and seconded by Mr. Samuel Hornick, representing the New York City Transportation Coordinating Committee. The meeting synopsis was unanimously accepted.

2. Adopt: Resolution #260 – Amendment to the 2008-2009 Unified Planning Work Program to Amend Nassau County, New York City Department of City Planning and NYMTC Staff Projects

Mr. Stephen Hausch introduced the resolution and said that it would adjust projects in the 2008-2009 Unified Planning Work Program that would enable Nassau County, New York City Department of City Planning and NYMTC staff to better address their planning needs and did not require new funding.

A motion to adopt Resolution #260, Amendment to the 2008-2009 Unified Planning Work Program to Amend Nassau County, New York City Department of City Planning and NYMTC Staff Projects was made by Mr. Lawrence Berger, representing the Nassau/Suffolk Transportation Coordinating Committee, and seconded by Mr. John Pilner, representing the Mid-Hudson South Transportation Coordinating Committee. The resolution was unanimously approved.

3. Adopt: Resolution #261 – Recommendation of Project Proposals for Funding Through the Transportation Enhancement Program

Ms. Nancy O'Connell explained that the purpose of the resolution was to adopt the prioritized listing of projects in the NYMTC Region proposed for funding consideration through the 2008 Transportation Enhancement Program (TEP). Ms. O'Connell said that the TEP is a federal reimbursement program under SAFETEA-LU administered by the New York State Department of Transportation for transportation projects of cultural, aesthetic, historic, and environmental significance. She said that the list would be submitted to the Governors Transportation Enhancement Advisory Committee for final selection of projects statewide.

A motion to adopt Resolution #261, Recommendation of Project Proposals for Funding Through the Transportation Enhancement Program was made by Ms. Patricia Chemka, representing the Mid-Hudson South Transportation Coordination Committee, and seconded by Ms. Linda Bailey, representing the New York City Transportation Coordinating Committee. The resolution was unanimously approved.

E. REGIONAL UPDATES

Year 3 Academic Projects from the September 11th Memorial Program for Regional Transportation Planning

Mr. Alan Borenstein said that five students, Nancy Mahadeo, Gitakrishnan Ramadurai, Matthew Roe, Brian Ross, and Timon Stasko, would be completing the third year of the academic initiative of the September 11th Memorial Program for Regional Transportation Planning. He said the
